VOTING WHILE TRANS CHECKLIST

BEFORE ELECTION DAY

- Go to **www.canivote.org** to register to vote, check your voter registration status, or update your voter information. In order to vote in South Carolina, you will need one of the following forms of I.D.:
 - **S.C. Driver's License**
 - **Federal Military ID**
 - **ID Card issued by a SC DMV**
 - **U.S. Passport**
 - **S.C. Voter Registration Card with Photo**
(Can be obtained for free from your county voter registration and elections office by providing name, DOB, and the last 4 digits of your SSN.)
- Make sure your I.D. matches the *name* and *address* on your voter registration at election time. **The law does not require your gender presentation match your name, photo, or gender marker.**
- In South Carolina, you can vote **absentee** under certain conditions. Call your county voter registration and elections office or visit **www.scvotes.org** for more information.

ON ELECTION DAY

- Bring your required photo I.D.
- It is also helpful, but not necessary to bring the following in case you are questioned:
 - **Your voter registration card**
 - **Utility bill showing your address**
 - **Additional I.D. or records that show who you are, or**
 - **Your legal name change paperwork if you had one**

IMPORTANT PLEASE READ

- If you are told you cannot vote on election day, call the **National Election Protection Hotline at 1-866-OUR-VOTE** for help.
- If you cast a provisional ballot the National Election Protection Hotline can help you make sure your ballot is counted.
